Clark County Commissioner Justin Jones to appear before federal judge in connection with alleged bribery/corruption case

Las Vegas, NV – Clark County Commissioner Justin Jones is scheduled to appear before a federal court judge on Thursday (10/20/2022) where a decision is expected on whether an evidentiary hearing will be held in the case of a controversial land deal dating back to 2018.

Specifically, Jones is accused of destroying public records and other evidence in an attempt to hide bribing now-Governor Steve Sisolak with political favors.

Jones is now being sued by developer Jim Rhodes for damages that could cost Clark County taxpayers more than \$1 billion. The suit comes as Jones is polling behind challenger Drew Johnson in his bid for reelection to his County Commission seat in District F.

“Justin Jones has been caught red-handed deleting public records and other evidence in an attempt to hide his illegal activities,” said Drew Johnson, Jones’ opponent in the race for District F. ***“Jones should be serving time, not serving on the County Commission.”***

Jones was acting attorney for an environmental group when the alleged corrupt deal with Sisolak was made. The deal aimed to kill plans for a residential development on 2,400 acres near Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area.
